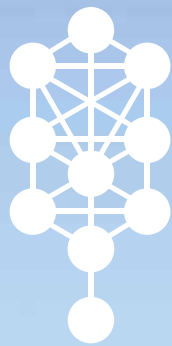

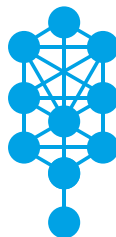

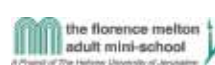
It's about Transformation. While Jewish in its origin and language, the Kabbalah Experience curriculum has a universal spiritual message. Our classes are specifically designed for people seeking a deeper understanding about life's purpose and meaning.

Kabbalah Experience classes consist of small groups in which questions and dialogue facilitate learning the principles of Kabbalah and help students apply them to personal growth. This adult-centered method of learning appeals to people who learn best when their own thinking process is encouraged and engaged.

The Kabbalah Experience curriculum draws upon selections from the major texts of the Kabbalah, including the Zohar and Sefer Yetzirah, the teachings of Isaac Luria, the Ba'al Shem Tov and his disciples, and more contemporary Kabbalah teachers. The curriculum also draws from the sciences — quantum physics and biology, as well as the spiritual wisdom of other cultures and insights from various schools of psychology.

Kabbalah Experience students deepen their understanding of themselves and the universe through exploring the ancient wisdom of Kabbalah. It's not about information, it's about transformation.

Year One Core Curriculum

The Year One Core Curriculum consists of three classes: Soul, Space and Time. It is recommended to start with Soul but the Year One Core classes can be taken in any sequence. They are a prerequisite for Year Two and Year Three classes. New students can take In Tune with Time or any elective class not listed as 'Advanced.'

Soul

The basic teachings of Kabbalah illuminate the parallel realities between the physical and spiritual dimension. Students learn the history of Kabbalah and teachings from the Zohar and the Kabbalistic masters of Tzfat. Students open up to a new awareness of the interconnectedness of souls and common miracles.

Space

All of physical reality is layered and flows down from higher worlds. The Tree of Life is the basic map of spiritual reality unique to the Kabbalah. It describes the process of the infinite becoming manifest as finite reality. Students learn to apply the Tree of Life as a tool to change the metaphors of their lives.

Time

Quantum physicists debate what time is or whether it even exists. Kabbalah penetrates the mystery of time by asserting that it is God's first creation. Students learn the concept of living in the present moment through Kabbalah's insights into the Sabbath and Passover and making each day count. (Offered in Spring.)

In Tune with Time

The celebration of the new month in the Jewish calendar begins with the new moon. According to Kabbalah, the Jewish calendar is a guiding light for personal transformation. Each of the twelve new moons offers different and unique energies that give us opportunities to understand and realize our own potential. For women only, this class meets twice each month.

Mystical Hebrew Letters

The early Kabbalah focused on the Hebrew letters and language and how this code underlies creation. The beauty of the letters is expressed through their meaning, shape, name and numerical value. The Hebrew letters are containers for the energies of time, including the months of the year and the 12 Spiritual Senses of Soul explained in Sefer Yetzirah (The Book of Formation).

Year Two Core Curriculum

The Year Two Core Curriculum is called Inner Transformation. It consists of three classes: Who Are You, Why Are You, and When Are You. Year Two classes parallel Year One classes as students apply the insights of Kabbalah to personal transformation.



Who Are You

Who we are at our essence is addressed as we look at the Kabbalah's insights into the structure of our souls. The Kabbalah teaches that there are five levels of soul. This study engages us to consider the masks we wear and who we are within those masks. Through this process students come to an awareness of soul.

Upon completing Year One and Two curricula, students can choose to continue with the Year Three Core Curriculum called Holding Opposites, take any year-long course or enroll in one of many Elective classes, including Kabbalah Review.



Why Are You

We return to the Tree of Life (Space) and focus on the "abstract" story level of our lives through engaging in metaphor work. The key to this inquiry is the realization that we are all living inside of the metaphors (stories) we have created or have been created for us with the practical implication of choosing, modifying or changing those stories.

When Are You

Time is revisited—and at this time we work on a personal relationship with living in the present moment. The Kabbalah teaches us to find a balance between our memories of the past and living in the present and to not live in the future. "This hour and this moment in which you stand never existed before. Who knows what can be attained now?" (Rebbe Nachman)

Inner Transformation

Year Three Core Curriculum

The Year Three Core Curriculum consists of three classes in which we apply the concept of Holding Opposites to the Kabbalistic worlds of our experience. Holding Opposites teaches us to have a more honest and direct relationship with all aspects of ourselves and our lives. Examples of opposites include: expansion and contraction, attraction and aversion, light and dark, inside and outside and separateness and oneness. Each successive world includes and contains the others and represents increasing levels of integration.

World of Action – Asiyah

focuses on the physical manifestation and verbal expression of our world and ourselves. Babies are born through the contraction and expansion of the cervix and universes are formed through contractions and expansions. In each set of opposites our physical bodies and the material world serve as a reference point to the holding of opposites.

World of Emotion – Yetzirah

shifts the focus to the interior world of our emotions and psychology. Using the example of contraction and expansion, we explore emotions and mind states that are expansive and those that are contracted with the goal to hold both — to experience the full range of our emotional capacities and enable a broader range of choice.

World of Thought – Briah

expands holding opposites to the conceptual arena of metaphoric and allegoric interpretation and the possibility that mystery and paradox hold the deepest truths. The worlds of Action and Emotion are integrated into a larger context of both personal and universal syntax — exploring the story level of our experiences.

The concept of non-duality is often misunderstood. To live free of duality does not mean we no longer differentiate between things. To live beyond duality means we embrace the whole of reality, including its parts. This concept of Wholeness is large enough to embrace wholeness and separateness and all other paradoxes and pairs of opposites. In Kabbalah the concept of non-duality is referred to as Holding Opposites.

Year Long Courses

We have designed year long classes for all those interested in studying a topic area in Kabbalah or another spiritual tradition. Some classes are marked Advanced and require students to have completed Year One and Year Two Core Curricula or a particular prerequisite. A student can choose to participate for one semester with permission of the instructor.

The Messiah and Messianic Age

What is the Jewish perspective on the Messiah and what has Kabbalah innovated in our understanding of the Messianic Age?

Fall Semester*: Introductory concepts and distinctions between the Messianic Age as a restorative or evolutionary process, overview of failed Messianic movements and a vision of the new emerging Messianic consciousness.

Winter Semester: In depth study of four significant Jewish Messianic Movements: Bar Kochva, Jesus, Shabbatai Tzvi and Menachem Mendel Schneerson.

Spring Semester: The Messianic vision as a radical change in the nature of our physical world, our consciousness and our relationship with Judaism.

Soul of Anatomy

Kabbalah considers the human body an analog of God. There are 248 positive mitzvot (commandments) and 248 "limbs" of the body thus creating detailed correspondences between body and soul. Textual study of the hidden meanings of the mitzvot reveals how we perfect the work of our souls through physical actions of mitzvot. Discussion is enhanced through body movement awareness led by Feldenkrais® practitioner Barbara Dubin.

Fall Semester: Introduction to the significance of the body manifesting as a structure of the soul. Studying mitzvot corresponding to the head, neck and shoulders.

Winter Semester: Studying mitzvot corresponding to the upper torso, ribs, spinal cord, arms, hands and chest (heart).

Spring Semester: Studying mitzvot corresponding to the lower torso, hips, pelvis, legs and feet.

World Mystics – Survey Class

The mystics testify to the profound scope and effect of the mystical experience that open us to a sense of wonder and freedom and an identity far greater than anything we intuit with our ordinary consciousness. This class is an exploration of spiritual perspectives from around the world into that Divine mystery.

Fall Semester: Eastern traditions — Vedanta Hinduism and Buddhism.

Winter Semester: Western traditions — Kabbalah, Christian Esotericism, and Sufism.

Spring Semester: The Shamanic experiences of various indigenous cultures — Native American and the KoiSan people of the Kalahari Desert.

World Mystics – Advanced

This course is for those people who have taken the World Mystics Survey Class.

This class fosters a deeper understanding and an experiential knowing of the mystical reality. We will be engaging the writings, teachings and spiritual practices of many of the greatest contemporary mystics from various spiritual traditions.

Fall Semester: Eastern mystics — Dalai Lama, Adyashanti, Krishnamurti.

Winter Semester: Western mystics — Gurdjieff, Martin Buber, Matthew Fox, Thomas Merton, Hazrat Inayat Khan.

Spring Semester: Shamanic/Indigenous mystics — Carlos Castaneda, David Cumes, Joseph Real, Jamie Sams, Banjo Clarke.

Zohar and Early Kabbalah – Advanced

While Jewish mysticism preceded the development of the Kabbalah for over a thousand years, what we know of as Kabbalah emerged in southern France and Spain in the 12th and 13th Century. We will study texts from the major works associated with this renaissance of Jewish mysticism and apply their teachings to our spiritual development.

Fall Semester: The Zohar — the classic text of Kabbalah..

Winter Semester: The Spanish Kabbalists prior to the Zohar from the sages of Gerona to Abraham Abulafia and his disciples.

Do you remember the names of the Sefirot and how created reality emerges from the infinite? The Year One Core Curriculum covers a myriad of concepts and introduces new language and new thinking. This class is not a rehash or a refresher. The core Kabbalah teachings are placed in a new context so that the learning is completely fresh, as we review. Completion of first year curriculum required.

Cultivating Your Inner Artist

(Year Round)

What challenges us and inspires us to express ourselves as artists and human beings? The Tree of Life serves as a map to the creative process. Open to artists or aspiring artists in all areas of creative expression. Artists from this class exhibited and presented at the Transformations Art Show at the Niza Knoll Gallery on Santa Fe Drive, July 2012.

Writing as a Spiritual Practice

(Year Round)

Writing can act as a gateway to be more intimate with the full mystery of who we are. We use writing as a tool to explore and shine light on the stories

we tell, and the hidden and unspoken assumptions we have about ourselves and the world. We use readings, discussions and writing prompts as a way to open our bodies, hearts and minds to the places in us where soul and spirit dwell.

Kabbalah Yoga (Year Round)

By integrating the wisdom of the Kabbalah into the practices of yoga we connect the body and mind as well as the spiritual teachings of the East and the West. We use yoga postures, breath awareness and meditation to deepen our exploration of who we are. This allows us to bring the Tree of Life into an awareness of our physical, emotional, mental and spiritual lives.

Reincarnation of Souls (Summer)

The Kabbalah introduced into Judaism the belief in reincarnation. The early Kabbalists were intrigued by the philosophic and moralistic ideas in the doctrine of reincarnation. Among the Kabbalah masters in Tzfat and the Chassidic Rebbes reincarnation was an experienced reality. Traditional Kabbalistic texts, scientific research and a group regression session help students appreciate the conceptual and experiential lessons of reincarnation for our spiritual awareness.

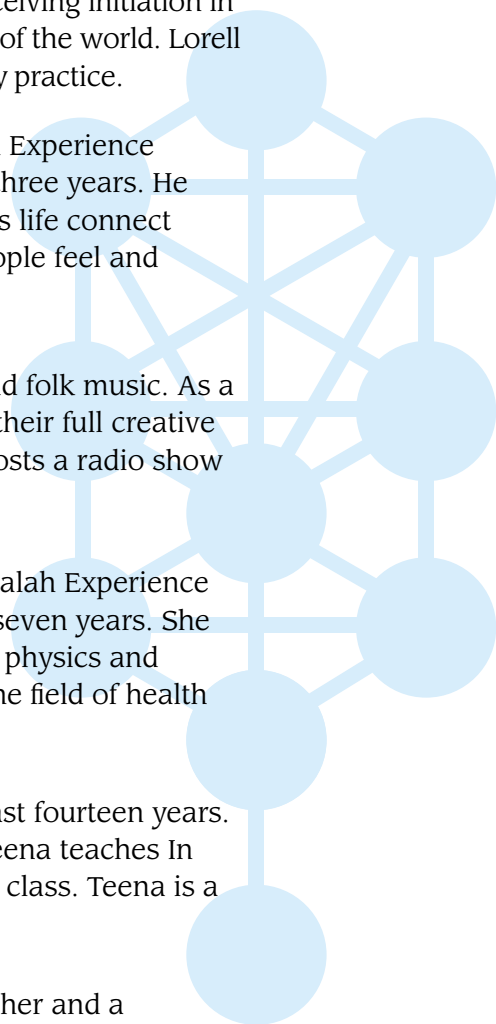

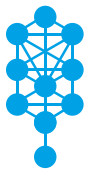
